Some stuff will be setup Saturday morning before the start of Field Day at 2 PM EST (1800 UTC). As long as people want to operate, the trailers will be open all night.

2025 ARRL Field Day - Are You Ready?

You can almost hear the synthesizer lead from the musical act Europe's 1986 hit, "The Final Countdown," playing in the air — we are just two weeks away from 2025 ARRL Field Day, taking place on June 28 – 29. As the excitement builds, 1067 sites are listed on the station locator tool. Each of them has a lot of work to do between now and the first "CQ Field Day" transmission.

Now is the time to check (and double-check) everything, according to ARRL Radiosport and Regulatory Information Manager Bart Jahnke, W9JJ. "Check all your gear and accessories. Put it on the air, and make sure there are no problems. Organize your power chain – from the generator to all the cables," he suggested.

Going through all the equipment, including antennas and antenna support structures, will keep any nasty surprises at bay when it's time to activate for the event.

It is also time to check on your people and places. "Reach out to everyone who said they wanted to come and make sure they are still able to. Build an operating schedule," said Jahnke. It's also a prudent time to check with the property owner where you intend to hold the activation. Follow up with local media and town officials that have been invited.

With the heat of summer bearing down, make sure there's enough water and sunscreen for the activation. A double-check of supplies now could spare you from unplanned errands during Field Day.

"More than anything, being prepared now will help you be present during Field Day," said ARRL Public Relations and Outreach Manager Sierra Harrop, W5DX. "This is a great opportunity to share the joy and community of amateur radio with people who may not get a chance to participate in it often – or it could be a first introduction. Prepare now so you can have fun the weekend of," she said.

ARRL The National Association for Amateur Radio® has many resources to help your activation thrive during the event. All the rules and information are at www.arrl.org/FieldDay. Order your 2025 ARRL Field Day merch by Thursday, June 19, to ensure your shipment arrives in time for Field Day.

ARRL also encourages clubs to use Field Day as an opportunity to onboard new members – both into the club and into amateur radio. Have a plan for prospective hams to become a part of the action through licensing classes, exam sessions, demonstrations, and future club activities. Invite them to your next club meeting and make them feel welcome. Exchange contact information and follow up with them. Field Day is a great outreach opportunity!

13 Colonies Event Founder Passing the Reins After 16 Years

<u>The 13 Colonies</u> 2025, a popular summer operating event, will take place less than a month from now, on July 1, 9:00 AM to July 7, midnight EDT (July 1 – 1300 UTC – July 8 – 0400 UTC).

This year the event will honor founder Ken Villone, KU2US, who is passing the torch to Tony Jones, N4ATJ. Villone has led the event for 16 years by working with state and bonus station coordinators and has grown from making approximately 12,000 contacts in 2009 to making 292,496 contacts around the world in 2024.

This year, one station will be operating in each of the 13 original British colonies, K2A – K2M, along with three bonus stations — WM3PEN, Philadelphia; GB13COL, England, and TM13COL, France — each representing their city, state, or country's role in America's colonial period.

Villone said event actually started 2008, right after he finished participating in the ARRL Sweepstakes.

"I remembered how fun it was but I could not figure out why there were not more of these types of special events on the air," said Villone. "So I decided to try my luck and create one, for one year only, to see what happens and to have some fun. I knew we had to offer a special QSL card and/or certificate plus have on hand a printer and supplies. The hard part was deciding what the event would commemorate and when to do this. I needed a theme that all could relate to and the event would have to be the type with multiple event stations involved, like the ARRL Sweeps."

"Then it hit me...13 colony states, during the 4th of July week and offer a certificate with the theme for the year. I made sure the theme was different each year with a different certificate design, to make it interesting and to also make the cert collectable. The theme would highlight some event or thing connected to the American Revolution."

"The inaugural event was held July 1st to the 4th, 2009, 4 days, with no advertising except on QRZ. I had a hard time getting 13 different ops, one from each colony state, but it worked out. All in all it was a success!"

Amateur radio operators and SWLs can participate in the event. Complete information about the call for each colony station and the bonus stations can be found on the <u>event website</u> or on Facebook at <u>13 Colonies Special Event Community</u>.
